PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Tena koutou,

Yesterday, five staff members including myself, attended a Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) course in Whangarei.

This is the first year that Waipu School has been involved in PB4L and the programme has been introduced into the school so that we can look at ways to improve the behaviour and learning across the school. The framework is based on international evidence.

The Positive Behaviour for Learning framework, is helping New Zealand schools build a culture where positive behaviour and learning is a way of life. The framework can be tailored to our school's own environment and cultural needs.

At Waipu School, our aim is to firstly identify what we think is our 'Ideal Student' – some of you will have made contributions to this already (and there will be more opportunities for you to do so, shortly). We will also be gathering data on inappropriate behaviours and be discussing, as a staff, any trends patterns we notice and how we can all have a consistent approach to dealing with these behaviours.

We will be exploring what we need to change in the environment and in systems and practices so that we can support students to make positive behaviour choices.

I'll keep you posted on progress as we work through the programme.

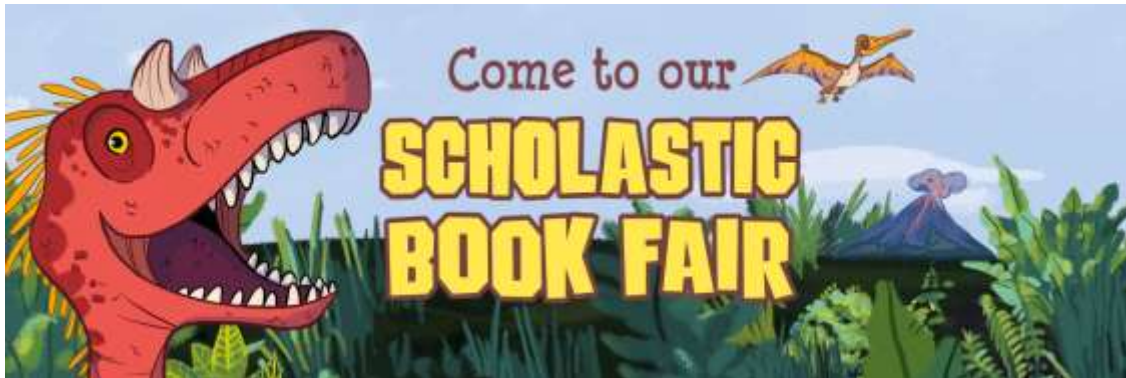


