PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Kia ora katoa,

Well, here we are again in Level 2, which is better than being in Level 3, so I suppose we should be grateful.

With this increase in Covid levels, comes a great deal of uncertainty. As a school, we are needing to consider carefully, risks associated with sending children off to camps or involving ourselves in activities that may exceed 100 members of the public. We do appreciate that, as parents, you may be anxious, so we will carefully weigh up all factors before making decisions. We will also endeavour to keep you as informed as possible of these decisions given the uncertainty and time frames.

Meanwhile, back at school, we are reinforcing hygiene messages, continuing to contact trace and being vigilant when children seem unwell. Thanks to those of you who err on the side of caution, and keep your child home when they are unwell.

On Monday evening the P.T.A. held their A.G.M and meeting. There was a small but enthusiastic number of parents turn up – and I'm pleased to report that we were able to fill the positions on the committee – Mel Jenkins will be chairperson for one more year (but will be vacating the position at the end of this year), Jenni Mansell will take over the secretary role and Stuart Knights will again be our treasurer.

On behalf of the school, I would like to thank those office holders for making themselves available but particular thanks to Janine Boulton for her service to the school as a PTA member and secretary. She has offered to remain on the PTA until after the Carnival, which is greatly appreciated.

I know I've said it before but it's worth repeating – that the staff value the contribution that you make to supporting the school – whether it be as parent help at the swimming sports, work on the PTA, or on day trips or camps.

I would request that if you do offer to help, that you make sure you'll be available. With any activity outside of the school, we need to meet a Health and Safety ratio of parents to children. I know staff have had sleepless nights worrying that they'll have enough help, when parents volunteer to help then unexpectedly pull out of events giving the organizer little notice or time to find others to take their place.

Fortunately, we nearly always find the help needed. Without that help – we wouldn't be able to do what we do, nearly as well or - if at all.
